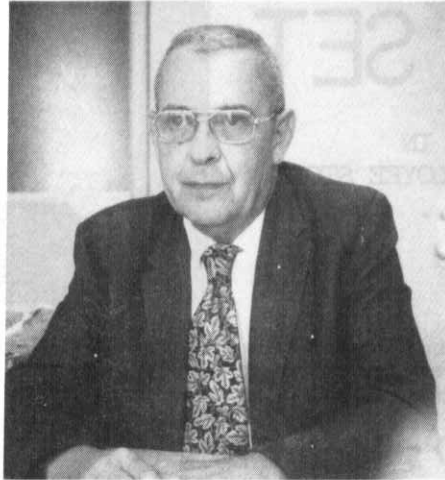

BOB SUTTON RETIRES TODAY; HE AND HIS WIFE, VI, ARE MOVING TO UTAH NEXT WEEK . . .

The Sutton's--Bob of MRD product service engineering and Violet of MRD's power line carrier export sales--have been very busy and quite excited lately. They've been preparing for their move to the State of Utah... since Bob will be retiring from General Electric today after having worked here for twenty years. His wife, Vi, has been with the company for 5 years.

Although he's retiring from GE and leaving Lynchburg, Bob says he has no intention of becoming inactive as far as work is concerned; there'll be plenty of opportunity to stay busy in Utah.

Bob says that he's never really known inactivity... even before his twenty years began at General Electric... and retirement is no excuse now. He says that his work in the electronics world started as early as 1927 when he obtained his first "ham" license, and later he followed it with a commercial operator's license in 1929. Bob worked for various radio broadcasting companies until 1949, but he left this field



for employment as a radio engineer with the State of Idaho, Department of Highways.

Mobile product planning in Syracuse was where he first worked for General Electric. Next, he served as a district sales manager in Boise, Idaho. Since coming to Lynchburg in 1959 with MRD's product service group, he's been confronted with countless challenges, and has become acquainted with hundreds of customers and friends.

He also mentions that, in his capacity as a liaison between product planning, engineering, customers and various agencies, he's logged



more miles in the air and on the road than he can count.

Originally educated for a career in chemical engineering, Bob goes on to say that he's been quite fond of his "second choice" career and has always found it to be challenging, interesting and fulfilling.

"When I got started in this business," Bob says, radio was essentially an entertainment medium. I've been fortunate to watch it grow beyond the entertainment phase into that of specialized communications for use on land, at sea, and in the air."

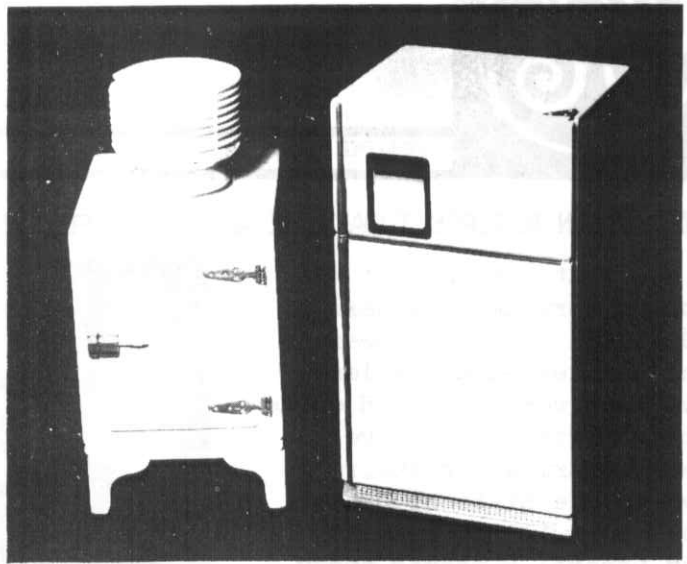

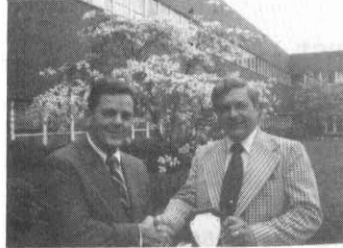

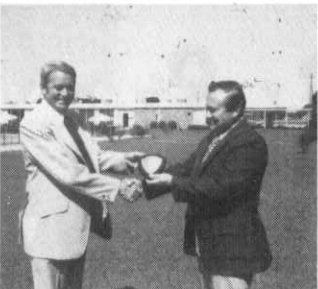
