The function of the "Priority Search Lock Monitor" is to always assure reception on a priority channel in a multiple frequency system.

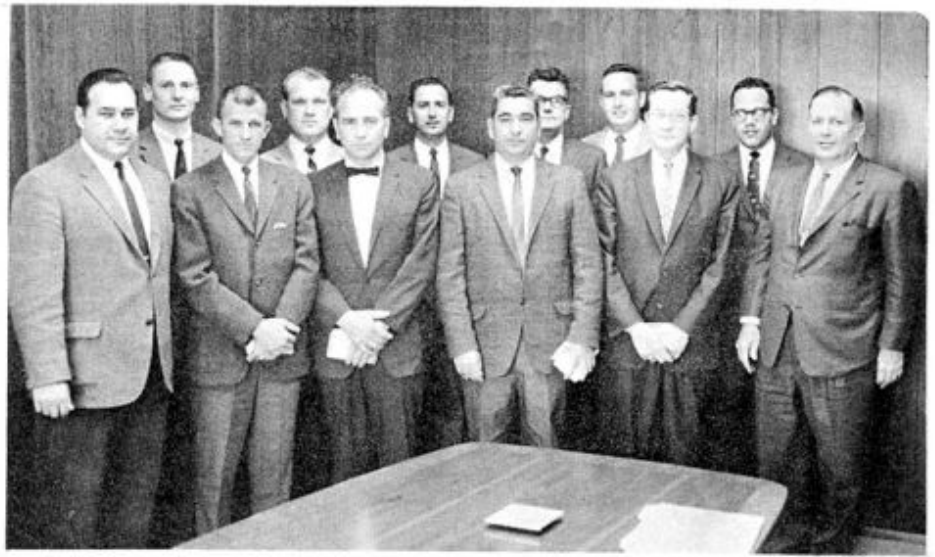
We've been making this device in the factory for some time, and shipments began in January of this year to customers such as the State of Illinois, the State of Texas, and the State of New York.

The title of their paper: "Today's Monitoring Dilemma--Two Channels at Once."

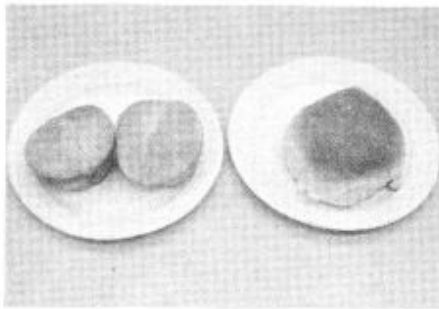
GENERAL ELECTRIC STOCK closed Friday afternoon at 92-5/8.

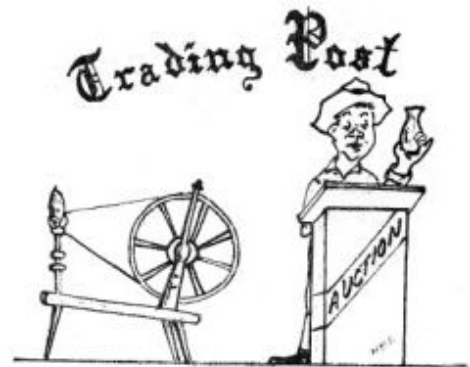


3¢--if this is his preference. Incidentally, the one large roll actually weighs 1/4 oz. more than the two smaller ones.
