ABOUT 10 TO FACE LACK OF WORK AFTER VACATION SHUTDOWN, BUT SOME 45 JOBS WILL BE AFFECTED

About 45 jobs will be eliminated in the factory as a result of lowered line rates, according to Hourly and Graded Salaried Relations Manager Bob Gosser, who adds that the reduction will be effective after the vacation shutdown.

"Currently the Employment Office is holding approximately 35 requests for personnel in other areas," says Bob, "so this means that, as it stands now, only about 10 people will actually be going out on lack of work."

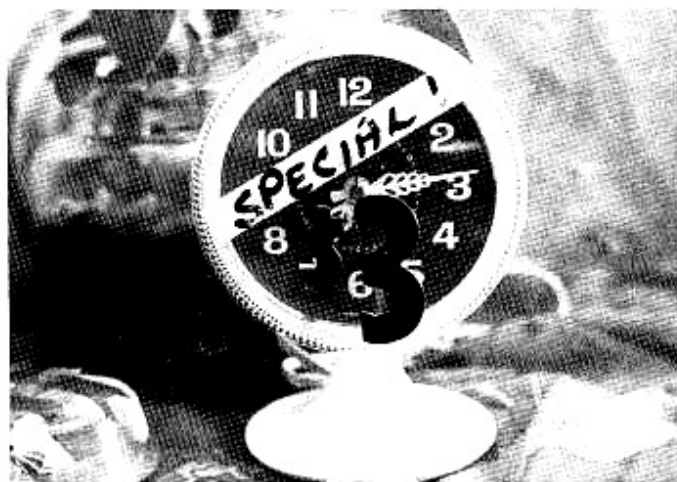
