Engineering, by nature, is a most rewarding pursuit and the formal filing of a patent application is always a bright spot in an engineer's career.

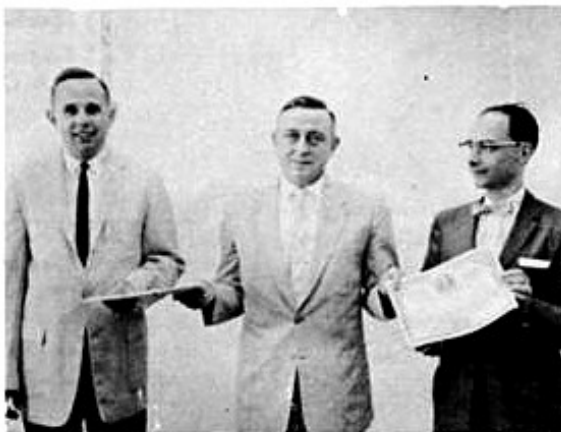
