THE BETTER TO SERVE -- Campbell County's young (2-year-old) and busy (100 and more calls per month) Rescue Squad got a boost in its ability to serve people last week with the installation of two-way mobile radio in its 32 crew members' cars. -- In the photo above, a crew member is seen receiving an emergency phone call...while a General Electric employee, Joe Carderelli, transmits a call to someone in the area. The General Electric base station controls the 32 mobiles while they are in service. -- The Squad bought all its mobile equipment, including an RC-4 remote control unit (located in the Squad President's basement...allowing 24-hour transmitting capability) from General Electric. through CPD's Factory Modernized Radio (FMR) program. -- A crew member in Lexington communicated crisply and clearly with the Squad over the weekend soon after the equipment had been installed. Lexington's Police Chief was in the car at the time -- amazed at the fine reception through the system. Already, Carderelli says, the units are helping the Squad provide better service to area people. This includes emergency first aid wherever needed; and emergency (only) transportation outside the City of Lynchburg (which is serviced by private service, and by a local Life Saving Crew). -- GE members of the Campbell County organization include Carderelli, Otis Maxey, Wayne Pulliam, Paul Coleman, Dick Porter and Melvin Hunter. The United Fund supported agency is located on Route 29 South, just past the Airport Road.
