## Emergency Bloodmobile Visit Friday Successful; GE Employees Thanked

The blood crisis in Lynchburg is over, at least for the moment, thanks in part to the tremendous response from GE employees Friday.

A TOTAL OF 299 PINTS WERE COLLECTED DURING THE EMER-GENCY BLOODMOBILE VISIT AT LYNCHBURG GENERAL HOSPITAL ... AND MORE COULD HAVE BEEN COLLECTED IF THERE HAD BEEN FACILITIES TO HANDLE THE DONORS, ACCORDING TO RED CROSS OFFICIALS.

"Everyone's attitude was terrific," said Alice Hinchcliffe of the local Red Cross Office. "We sincerely regret that many people had to wait--or had to leave before making their donation-but it was a crisis situation and we hope everyone understands."

THE TERRIFIC RESPONSE TO THE EMERGENCY BLOODMOBILE VISIT TEMPORARILY RELIEVES THE PRESSURE THAT THE LOCAL CHAPTER WAS UNDER FROM BEING ON PROBATION.

"As of Friday night we were at 100% of quota," says Alice. "However, we still have 250 pints to collect during the remainder of the month to stay on quota."

OR, TO PUT IT ANOTHER WAY, ACCORDING TO ALICE, ALTHOUGH LYNCHBURG IS TECHNICALLY OFF PROBATION, THIS AREA IS STILL OFFICIALLY ON PROBATION UNTIL JUNE 30, 1968, AS A RESULT OF NOT MEETING 95% OF QUOTA DURING THE LAST SIX MONTHS OF 1967.

BLOODMOBILE VISITS ARE SCHED-ULED FOR NEXT TUESDAY, JAN. 23, AT QUAKER MEMORIAL PRES-BYTERIAN CHURCH, FROM 10:30 A.M. TO 4:30 P.M., AND AT ALTAVISTA JAN. 25, FROM 11:00 A.M. TO 5:00 P.M.

THE 1967 TABLE IS NOT NEARLY AS COMPLICATED AS THE ONE PUBLISHED LAST YEAR FOR 1966. DURING 1967, SALES TAX IN VIR-GINIA AMOUNTED TO 3% FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR.

By contrast, the sales tax picture in Virginia 51 63 76 84 88 54 67 80 89 93 57 71 84 94 98 60 75 88 99 103 62 79 92 104 108 during 1966 was a hodgepodge with "local option" in Lynchburg and surrounding areas.

SO, IN LYNCHBURG, AS WELL AS MOST SURROUNDING COUN-TIES, THIS 1967 CHART COVERS THE 3% TAX, 2% OF WHICH IS STATE AND 1% OF WHICH IS LOCAL.


