Major Milestone Passed: Lynchburg Is Now Headquarters For General Electric's Communication Systems Division

Lynchburg, Virginia, is now a Division Headquarters for the General Electric Company—a major milestone in the growth of Lynchburg GE which began slightly less than 14 years ago when, on September 23, 1955, the Company announced the move of

its rectifier business to Lynchburg from Lynn, Mass.

With more than 6,000 employees in the new Lynchburgheadquartered division, about 4,000 of whom are employed here in the city, the growth of GE employment opportunities for Virginia workers has been phenomenal over the past decade and a half.

Also, today, we'll have to start learning a new set of abbreviations...and bid a fond farewell to the long-familiar "CPD"--Communication Products Department, which is now TPD--Telecommunication Products Department.

TPD--Telecommunication
Products Department. (Acting
General Manager: Dick Gifford).

MRD--Mobile Radio Department (General Manager: Glenn Petersen).

<u>C&CDD</u>--Communication and Control Devices Department in Waynesboro, formerly known as Specialty Control Department. (General Manager: Warren Kindt).

Fortunately we don't have to relearn "SPD." This is the abbreviation for the Semi-conductor Products Department which maintains its Polycrystalline Semiconductor Products Business Section here. Bob Frenzel is the Business Section's Manager.

HERE'S A CAPSULE SUMMARY OF LYNCHBURG GE MILESTONES...

Sept. 23, 1955. GE announces move of its rectifier business to Lynchburg from Lynn, Mass. Prediction: 800 employees.

June 18, 1956. First local employee hired.

June 25, 1957. New plant containing 264,000 square feet of floor space completed on 122 acres of land.

<u>Dec. 31, 1957.</u> 850 employees on payroll, full staffing for the rectifier business.

July 25, 1958. GE announces move of its communication business from upstate New York (mainly Syracuse and Utica) to Lynchburg.

Aug. 14, 1958. Carroll Avenue Plant space leased.

Jan. 1, 1959. Lynchburg formerly designated as worldwide headquarters for GE's Communication Products Dept.

Dec. 31, 1959. 2200 employees on payroll as communication business is staffed for production.

Jan. 18, 1960. New two-

story office building addition completed at Mountain View containing 33,000 square feet.

July 13, 1960. Entire Mountain View Road Plant air conditioned.

Dec. 31, 1961. 3000 employees on payroll (which has been maintained or exceeded since that time).

Mar. 15, 1962. Major manufacturing and office building expansions completed, adding 120,000 square feet of floor space for total of 417,000 in new space plus 200,000 leased space.

June 10, 1966. Family Day Open House, commemorating 10th anniversary for General Electric in Lynchburg.

Feb. 5, 1968. Mobile Radio Business Section established as part of Communication Products Dept.

Jan. 1, 1969. Mobile Radio Department established from former business section.

Sept. 1, 1969. Lynchburgheadquartered Communication Systems Division established.
