Q: If office people are not allowed in the South Cafeteria during factory breaks and the doors are locked at 10:15 at the end of factory breaks, when are we supposed to go?

A: The major challenge is to provide quality food service to all employees over an extended period of time.

Because of the 10 minute break periods for factory employees, office employees are asked to avoid the cafeterias from 9:00 to 10:00 AM and 2:00 to 3:00 PM.

Office employees are encouraged to patronize the South Cafeteria for counter service either from 8:45 AM to 9:00 AM or from 10:00 AM to 10:15 AM. Vending outside the cafeterias is available at all times.

After 10:15 AM the cafeteria is being cleaned and the food prepared for the noon hour. Only the vending machines are available during this time (no counter service) so that adequate time can be devoted to setting 10:15 - 11:00 AM. up for lunch. In order to permit the cleaning service
