## Who Is A GE Dependent?

From time to time questions have arisen concerning GE Insurance Plan coverage for an employee's dependents. Here is a brief explanation of some of the provisions explaining "dependent."

The term "dependent" means an employee's spouse. Spouse refers to wife or husband - any GE employee may apply for dependent insurance for the marriage-mate as long as that one is not a GE employee too.

Now what about the children? One thing that will always disqualify a child" being your dependent is marriage, no matter what the other circumstances may be. Suppose your 18 year old gets married, and continues in college, and you continue to be the sole support -- marriage cancels dependency of a child. An opposite extreme would be that your unmarried 18 year old works full time, perhaps earns as much as you do! You can still include this one as a dependent because he has not attained age 19. But as soon as age 19 is attained, the child who is employed full time ceases to qualify as a dependent. Suppose your child remains unmarried, lives at home, is no longer a student and has no job. This one may remain your de-

> GE TEXTOLITE TO BE HANDLED IN LYNCHBURG BY TAYLOR BROS.

GE's Textolite<sup>(T)</sup> decorative surfacing, a high-pressure laminated plastic material used in kitchen countertop and bathroom vanity surfacing applications, will be handled by Taylor Bros., Inc., 1501 Rutherford St., Lynchburg, according to George MacKay, Sales Representative for the Coshocton, Ohio-based Laminated Products Department of GE. George dropped by the News office the other day with the thought that Lynchburg GE employees might be interested in knowing about this.

In solids, woodgrains, and abstract patterns, the laminated plastic is available in a full range of standard sizes in General Purpose Grade, .062 inches thick, and in postforming grade, .051 inches thick, with satin finish.

Textolite is produced by assembling a "core" of several layers of craft paper, a printed pattern sheet and an overlay containing melamine. The layers, impregnated with resins, are fused together in a press at pressures of more than 1,000 psi and temperatures in excess of 300 degrees F. It has a high resistance to wear, burns, stains, moistures, and water, and dimensional change.

pendent until age 23 so long as he remains in the same status. Here, age 23 becomes the disqualifier for carrying this one as a dependent.

What about after age 23? Well, if the child is not married, is not employed full time, is still principally dependent upon the employee, and his coverage has been continuous, two special qualifications will permit continued coverage as a dependent: either

- a) he continues as a full time student, or
- b) he is incapable of supporting himself, due to mental illness or retardation or physical handicap, medically proven.

There are many other things to remember about dependency. A few are listed below:

- a) No parent, uncle, aunt or similar relative may be considered a dependent, even if the Internal Revenue Service allows income tax dependency.
- b) Your dependent may not reside outside of the United States or Canada.
- c) Your dependent is disqualified if in the armed forces of any country.
- d) "Children" includes natural children and legally adopted children, no matter where or with whom they live, except outside the U.S. or Canada.
- e) Step children are covered but they must reside in the employee's household.
- f) Finally, any child (related or otherwise) may be a covered dependent provided he is supported solely by the employee and is permanently residing in the household of which the employee is the head.
