GE Files Two Petitions To Increase Employee Pay, Benefits Under Freeze

General Electric has filed two petitions with the Govern- corporate employee benefits ment's Office of Emergency Preparedness requesting permission to put pay and benefit increases into effect that GE believes should fall within the guidelines and intent of the wage freeze but felt a clarification ruling was necessary.

This week the company's component asked "permission to put into effect the company's long standing vacation pay practices...which bases the amount of paid vacation according to the number of years of continuous service." The petition specifically asks about initial vacations

which go into effect for employees reaching one year of service, as well as about vacation increases for employees with longer service.

On Monday, September 20, the company's corporate employee compensation components filed for permission to put into effect the progression

pay increases which have been delayed by the wage freeze which began August 15. They referred specifically to wage and salary increases based on learning the job and achieving productivity and output levels as described in GE pay plans and negotiated union agreements which existed prior to the freeze.
