OUR COMMUNICATIONS BUSINESS MERITS MENTION IN COMPANY'S 1976 ANNUAL REPORT....

"A new General Electric" in which communications is earmarked for an increasingly important role is described in the 1976 Annual Report of the company, now being mailed to shareholders.

In a message by Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer Reginald H. Jones, the report comments: "Comparing the Company today with the General Electric of only a few years ago shows that, in selectively allocating our resources to the growth opportunities identified through strategic planning, we have developed decidedly different sources of earnings and a different mix of businesses, whose potentials for profitable growth exceed those of our historic product lines..."

The GE official mentioned communications as one of several fast-growing areas to which substantial resources have been allocated. In another section, it states: "Communications equipment including mobile radio and data communications, had a substantial year of growth. Fifty percent ownership of Storno, a respected European manufacturer of mobile radio,
