U.S.MRD scours world for new components sources

FAR EAST COMPONENT SEARCH SHOULD RESULT IN EXPANDED LIST OF VENDORS FOR QUALITY PARTS AND A SAVINGS OF SOME \$1/2 MILLION

"We went shopping in the Far East for quality and for cost," Purchasing Manager Earl Ackley reports, and believe we've found good potential sources for high-quality, low-cost electronic components for our products."

Earl and Jim Sears, Components Engineering Manager, recently returned from a company-sponsored trip to China and Japan as part of a five-member GE team which included three people from corporate purchasing. The five also carried information and data for a lot of other GE businesses.

Thirty-four manufacturers were contacted on the 23-day trip, and the group toured 28 factories. (Due to the present energy shortage in China, there was no heat in their factories nor in their public buildings.)

"I discussed technology," and Earl talked sales and distribution," Jim says. "We felt we were a super team!

"Our objectives were to inform these component manufacturers that industrial markets do exist in the US; review our component requirements; and request samples and quotations where there was a mutual interest."

'We found the components being built in both countries are very good," Earl says. 'The technology is there-the quality is superior."

The group also found that Japan, being highly automated, can generally supply the quantity of components we need. At present, China, where more work is done manually, cannot meet our needs in quantity, "but they were very interested to work with us in making long-term arrangements," Jim notes.

rising costs. "It's really a one-world market now,"
Earl says, "and we can get high-quality materials from Japan about as quickly as from Chicago. Expanding our off-shore procurement efforts just has to be a major thrust in the next few years in order to support the growth of the business."

The team feels the tour was quite successful. "We got a lot of quotes," Earl says, "and our decision to buy could mean an almost immediate savings of \$500,000 to our business, and an even larger savings figure in the future. But equally important...we have expanded our list of vendors for quality parts."
