TALKING PORTA-MOBIL -- Two men in Engineering demonstrate the portability of CPD's new mobile unit which will be shown to customers around the nation this week. These two men, like many others in Manufacturing and Engineering --Marketing and Product Planning as well -- had key roles to play in successful launching of new product...first of its kind on the market. Shown at left is Wayne Dalton, a Systems Design Engineer...who coordinated efforts of others who worked on transmitter, receiver and mechanical design. His job was to make sure that the good, independent efforts of others meshed well in a compatable, top-quality unit. With CPD for eight of his ten GE years, Wayne predicts "a good future" for Porta-Mobil: "It's one of the hottest products I've seen...and will pick up new business for us" he says. --At right is Gil Guedj (pronounced Gage), who did most of the mechanical design drafting work on this project. Gil came to Lynchburg from Tunis, Tunisia, where he had served in the French Army, had been a German prisoner, and later served on the Police Force in the North African former French Protectorate. After immigrating to the USA, Gil joined GE in the factory sheet metal area in July, 1957; later was an arc welder before going into Engineering as a draftsman. He is now a Designer (in Mobile Drafting Area).




